
JUSTICE

CO-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MESSAGE CONT'D

At URSSE, our structure is based on a co-executive directorship (co-ED) model. The co-ED model benefits from the convergence and collaboration of two distinct and effective leadership styles while distributing and sharing leadership of the organization to tap multiple talents, better manage the work demands/expectations of the position, and move in a direction that creates more leadership opportunities. We have entered into this new model strategically, creating authentically shared leadership and power rather than a training or assistant directorship in disguise. To date, this has been a successful approach.

Our modus operandi is to remain vigilant about how we distribute authority, leadership, and power. We have several vehicles through which we are doing so.
